

Prof. Dr. Dariusz Krok

Dariusz Krok is Professor of Psychology and Pastoral Theology at University of Opole, Poland, and Vice-Director of The Institute of Family Sciences in Opole. His academic work concentrates on the domains of social psychology, psychology of religion, and health psychology. Within these areas, he has conducted research analysing relations between religiousness and quality of life, health and personality traits, persuasion and attitude change. He also conducts research on examining relations between religion and family, the role of religion in a family setting, religious attitudes of parents and their adolescent children, and assessing the outcomes of coping with stress on adjustment to cancer among individuals and their families. In recent years, he has also been involved in projects aimed at providing support and assistance to families with migration and social problems in Poland. He is author and co-editor of several books, e.g. *Perswazja w przekazie religijno-moralnym*, Opole 2005 [Persuasion in religious and moral communication], *Psychologiczny wymiar cierpienia*, Opole 2007 [The psychological dimension of suffering], and *Religijność i jakość życia w perspektywie mediatorów psychospołecznych*, Opole 2009 [Religiousness and quality of life in the perspective of psychosocial mediators], *Rodzina w nurcie współczesnych przemian. Studia interdyscyplinarne*, Opole 2010 [Family in the perspective of contemporary changes. Interdisciplinary studies], *W poszukiwaniu znaczenia choroby nowotworowej*, Opole 2017, [Insearch for the meaning of cancer] and over 60 articles printed in academic journals, e.g. *Personality and Individual Differences*, *Aging and Mental Health*, *Journal of Religion and Health*.
