Dimiter Philipov completed his Ph.D. at the Higher Institute for Economics in Sofia. In 1993-1994 he visited the Princeton University, Office of Population Research, where he received a Mid-career Certificate in Demography. From 1995 to 1998 he worked at the Institute of Demography at the Bulgarian Academy of Sciences. In 1998 he moved to the Max-Planck Institute for Demographic Research in Rostock, Germany, where he worked as a senior scientist in the Data Laboratory. Since 2003, he worked at the Vienna Institute of Demography in Austria, where he was leader of the research group on comparative European Dynamics and worked in the area of fertility and family. Since 2013, he works at the International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis, Laxenburg, Austria. In this institute, which is a member of the Wittgenstein Centre for Demography and Global Human Capital, he works in the area of ageing and health. He was leading and participating in numerous international research projects mostly at the European Union, and at the United Nations. The last project where he was leading a work package was "Families and Societies" at the 7th Framework Programme of the EU, completed in 2017.
