Gunhild O. Hagestad, a sociologist, is Senior Researcher at Norwegian Social Research/ OsloMet – Oslo Metropolitan University, and Professor Emerita at the University of Agder. Earlier, she held positions at the University of Oslo, Northwestern University, Pennsylvania State University, and the University of Chicago. She has been invited guest professor at McMaster University, Free University, Amsterdam, University of Bremen, Case Western University, Reykjavik University and Seoul National University. A keynote speaker at many international conferences, she delivered the opening address for the United Nations International Year of Older Persons (1999), with the theme "Towards a society for all ages". Subsequently, she had numerous UN consultancies. Her research, mostly multi-national projects, has focused on intergenerational relationships, grandparenthood and life patterns in aging societies. She has received the Distinctive Creative Achievement Award from The Gerontological Society of America, the Matilda White Riley Distinguished Scholar Award from the American Sociological Association, and the Norwegian Sociological Association's highest honor. A member of the Norwegian Academy of Arts and Sciences, she was also named a Fellow at NIAS, the Netherland Institute of Advanced Studies.
