Professor Zitha Mokomane is an Associate Professor in the Department of Sociology at the University of Pretoria, South Africa. She holds a MA and a PhD in Demography, both from the Australian National University. Prof. Mokomane has extensive research, policy and programmatic expertise in the fields of family studies, with specific interest in work-family interface; social policy analysis; as well as poverty reduction and social protection. She has published widely and has led many national and international research projects on these issues. She has been a member of a number of UN experts groups including those preparing for International Year of the Family 2014. She is currently a member of the SDGs & Families project, which aims to help policymakers to understand the role of families in supporting societies and how public policy decisions can directly and indirectly affect family and child well-being. Prof Mokomane has a C2 rating from the South African National Research Foundation which is awarded to those recognised as established researchers who have produced a body of quality work, the core of which has coherence and attests to ongoing engagement with the field.
